



## *Contributions & Charges Year Ten*

### **Information for Parents/Guardians – 2026 Contributions and Charges**

Government funding provides for the core educational needs of students in Western Australian public schools, including staffing, facilities, and basic resources. Schools receive funding based on student enrolments and individual learning needs. However, financial contributions from families play a vital role in enhancing the quality and breadth of learning experiences offered.

### **Contributions (Years 7–10)**

Kambalda West District High School requests a voluntary contribution of up to **\$235 per student**, used to support classroom resources and materials such as:

- Photocopying, printed/electronic materials
- Textbooks, reading materials
- Science and art supplies
- Technology & Enterprise consumables
- PE equipment

### **Charges (K–10)**

Extra Cost Optional Charges are optional activities or services that incur compulsory charges if selected. These include:

- Camps, excursions, incursions
- School photos
- Social events

These activities are not covered by standard contributions and rely on full payment to proceed.

In accordance with requirements of the School Education Act 1999 and School Education Regulations 2000, the Kambalda West District High School (DHS) School Council has reviewed and endorsed the schedule of the Contributions, Charges and Personal Items Lists for 2026.

A maximum voluntary contribution of \$235 is requested for Year 7 and Year 10 students, equating to less than \$6 per week or \$60 per term. Voluntary contributions are directly applied to each learning area to support your child's education by enabling the school to purchase extra materials, services and resources that are used daily in the classroom. Families are encouraged to make these contributions to help support enhanced learning opportunities.

## 2026 Charges and Extra Cost Optional Charges for School-Based Activities

Students in Years 9 and 10 will choose an additional three elective courses each semester. These compulsory elective charges are to be paid in full by **Week 4**, of each semester. Students may be placed into a lower cost option if the charges are not paid.

Elective Courses are sent home with the students prior to the end of the current school year. Year 9/10 high-cost elective choices will require a deposit at the time of lodging preference sheets.
